ROSEMOUNT RECRUITING FOR CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

This fall, Rosemount residents have an opportunity to get close to the action involved in policing of the community – a lot closer than watching a police drama on TV. The Rosemount Police Department will hold another session of its Citizens Police Academy on Thursdays: September 24, October 1, 8, 22, and 29 and November 5 and 12 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.

The program offers insight into modern-day policing in our community through classroom and hands-on training conducted by Rosemount Officers. Training will involve a variety of topics including an overview of Department operations, a tour of the Police facility, a review of patrol operations, driving under the influence arrests (D.U.I.), a narcotics presentation, investigations, crime scene processing, M.A.A.G. (SWAT) and firearms, use of force/self-defense, school-liaison duties, arrests, search and seizure issues, traffic stops, community policing/crime prevention, and the chaplain program.

At the completion of the program, students will be given the opportunity to ride along with an Officer. It is our hope that each graduate will feel informed, have an understanding about the operations of the Department, and know the person behind the badge. Through relationships and partnerships the Police and community provide a safer Rosemount.

The academy is free and open to individuals who live or work in the City of Rosemount and are at least 18 years of age. All participants will be subject to a criminal background check. The deadline to apply is September 11, 2015.
