TASK FORCE TO STUDY FACILITY NEEDS IN ROSEMOUNT

The City of Rosemount is seeking additional residents to serve on the newly created City Facilities Task Force. The task force will study short- and long-term space needs for non-park and recreation facilities, including City Hall, Police, and Public Works.

The Metropolitan Council projects that Rosemount's population will grow from 23,000 today to 38,000 in 2040. With that growth, current municipal facilities may not be large enough to meet future demands for service to the community.

The task force will study existing buildings and recommend to the City Council what changes are needed, when they should take place, and how much they will cost. Up to seven Rosemount residents will be appointed to serve on the task force through the end of next year.

Residents interested in serving on the task force may pick up an application at City Hall. Commission application forms are also available on the City's website at www.ci.rosemount.mn.us/commissionapp. Applications are due by May 27, 2016.
