ROSEMOUNT CITY COUNCIL REACHES OUT THROUGH MEETING IN THE PARKS

The Rosemount City Council will make it easier for citizens to participate in the Council's work by holding a meeting in the City's parks.

The Council will hold its work session for June at Jaycee Park, 15425 Shannon Parkway, on Monday, June 13, at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be held outside but will move into the park shelter if weather requires it.

"We'd like to make it easier for interested residents to take part," said Mayor Bill Droste, noting that increasing citizen engagement is one of the top priorities for the Council this year.

Council work sessions are always open to the public at City Hall, but Council members decided they would like to try a meeting in the neighborhoods to make them more accessible.

The sessions are intended for less-formal discussions among Council members on issues before they come up for final action at regular meetings. Work sessions usually do not include a section for public comment, but the Council will invite input during the sessions in the parks.
