- Rosemount's Fire Department consists of all volunteer firefighters. Each firefighter is paid per call that are in attendance.
 - Examples of calls the Fire Department may be requested to handle include, hazmat calls, fire related calls, and vehicle accidents.
 - Voelker discussed opportunities such as becoming an Explorer. Youth, ages 14 to 20 can join the Fire Explorers Scouting of America. If anyone is interested, they can contact Assistant Chief Voelker.
