- 26 year old male returned home at 7:00 in the morning intoxicated and unable to stand. He was transported willingly to Fairview Ridges hospital for extreme intoxication. He had a BAC of .39
- Disturbance in the parking lot of Cub Foods where a female driver reportedly came close to hitting a male shopper walking in the parking lot while she was turning into a parking space. The male got angry and rammed his shopping cart into the side of the female's vehicle. An argument ensued and some spectators gathered. Officers separated the parties. Following review surveillance video, the male shopper was sent a citation for misdemeanor damage to property.
- A traffic stop on a vehicle on CR 46 for having a cracked windshield and no working license plate light resulted in felony 5th degree drug charge due to finding a baggie with a small amount of suspect methamphetamine, another baggie containing an unknown substance, a couple of pipes and several needles, not to mention the driver had a revoked license.
- Report of a yard on fire in the 38XX block of 155th Street. Homeowner was having a fire in her backyard and flying embers started the backyard on fire. With the high wind and dry conditions, the Fire Dept. said it wasn't too wise to start a recreational fire. In any conditions, residents should have a water hose handy in case of fire spreading.
- There have been several instances of illegal dumping in the City where people have dumped old mattresses or couches and other garbage on a random curb. There are other options to get rid of items you no longer want such as 1-800-GOT-JUNK, the Salvation Army, Good Will or Facebook Marketplace.
- On our snowy Tuesday: A Dodge Ram pickup traveling too fast for the conditions on County Road 42 near Akron Avenue slid off the road into the backyard fence of a home on Bayberry Circle. The male driver was not injured but some surrounding trees did not fare so well and the fence was severely damaged.
- An hour later and some distance west at Shannon Parkway and Cobbler Avenue, a female driver slid off the roadway into the yard of a home on Cobbler Avenue striking a shrub and a no-longer functioning light pole. Again, thankfully, the driver was not injured.
- An unknown party drove into the front yard of a home on the 30XX block of Lower 147th Street. The vehicle hit a tree in the yard and then left. No known suspect.
- We had several calls of loose dogs this past week. Please make sure your fur babies are safe in your home or backyard during the cold winter months and are not able to get loose. Remember, the City of Rosemount has an ordinance requiring all dogs to be on a leash.
