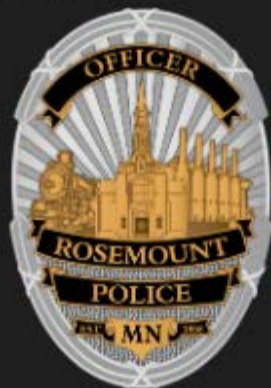

- Caller reported a female driver of another vehicle appeared to have fallen asleep at the wheel shortly before the stoplight at Highway 3 and County Road 42. Caller woke the sleeping driver up and the driver continued to drive west on County Road 42. Following the caller's directions, officers were able to find the vehicle and conduct a traffic stop. After failing field sobriety testing and providing a PBT of .19, the 33 year old female driver was arrested for 3rd degree DWI.
- Homeowner in the 149XX block of Dallara Avenue reported that his mailbox was knocked over. The post also included two other mailboxes. No suspect.
- Officers responded to a road and driving complaint where the caller said a vehicle was swerving all over the road going south on Highway 3. Following the caller's directions, officers were able to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle at Connamara and Azalea. The vehicle contained four males who said they were on their way back to work after a lunch break. The vehicle smelled like alcohol. Field sobriety tests were conducted on the driver and he blew a PBT of .08. He was cited for careless driving, driving after revocation and open bottle after officers found an open case of Corona including 9 empty bottles, an open case of Modelo including at least 20 empty cans and an empty bottle of tequila.
- A traffic stop was conducted on a 41 yr old male who was hauling a trailer without the proper registration. The male said he did not have his driver's license because it was stolen and gave the officer his name and date of birth. The officer checked the DVS picture of the name given and the picture did not match at all. The officer received information from the Dakota County Sheriff's office on the identity of the male driver and his picture in DVS matched perfectly to the name they gave. The male had six warrants for his arrest for felony 5th Degree controlled substance, felony 3rd Degree controlled substance, felony 3rd degree burglary, misdemeanor theft, gross misdemeanor false info and gross misdemeanor probation violation. While speaking with the male, the officer saw a needle in plain sight in the vehicle which led to a search of the vehicle. This resulted in locating several items of drug paraphernalia, THC cartridges, and several items which could possibly be stolen. The male was arrested on fresh charges of felony 5th degree controlled substance, gross misdemeanor false info, vehicle registration violation and driving after cancellation, along with the six warrants and the trailer was seized.
- A 911 call was placed around noon from a homeowner on Davy Ct saying a male driving a vehicle had just ran a stop sign and crashed in her yard. The driver appeared to be unconscious. Officers arrived to find a 63 yr old male in the driver's seat semi-unresponsive with a case of Bud Light Lime on the passenger seat. Paramedics responded and the male was taken to the hospital where a search warrant was completed by the officer to obtain a blood draw from the male. This was done because his blood alcohol content did not seem high enough for the male to be that unresponsive and it was suspected that he had also consumed a controlled substance with the alcohol. Charges are pending the results of the blood draw.
- 19 yr old female from Lakeville called saying she was sitting outside St. Joseph's Catholic Church and she was intoxicated. She said her mom was upset with her after an argument about school. After repeated attempts to contact her mother, the 19 yr old was transported to Riverside Hospital.
- An officer was on patrol at 1:30am Monday morning facing southbound at the intersection of Diamond Path and County Road 46 when he noticed a car sitting beyond where Diamond Path ends. The officer could see brake lights and reverse lights lighting up. He discovered a couple had driven off the road and were trying to get the vehicle out of the snow. Both occupants were obviously intoxicated. The 58 yr old male driver stated they were coming from White Castle in Apple Valley and he thought he was at Johnny Cake and County Road 42. The male driver was arrested for 4th degree DWI after failing field sobriety tests and providing a BAC of .14.
- Two juvenile females (age 16 and 17) were trespassed from Cub Foods for vaping in the building and not complying with requests to leave. They went from the front of the building, to the bathroom, to the parking lot and eventually went to the tobacco store. They said they were using the Wifi. Neither girl wanted her parents to be called, however, they were called and both girls were sent home with trespass notices.
