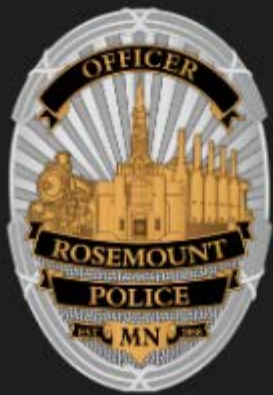

WEEKLY SNAPSHOT

Dec 4th - Dec 10th 2020



- Baby Jesus and a camel were stolen out of a yard on the 14XXX block of Chili Avenue. Scrooge activity.
- A 50-year-old woman was found deceased on the floor next to her bed by her family. An autopsy is pending.
- Officers responded to a 911 hang-up coming from the the "U of MN" property near the wind turbine. Simultaneously, a nearby resident called 911, saying they could hear arguing coming from the wooded area near their home. Officers arrived and found a 29 year old female sitting in her vehicle crying, saying she was assaulted by her boyfriend and he left on foot into the woods. With assistance from Dakota County Sheriff's Office and Farmington PD, officers located the 29-year-old male and arrested him for felony domestic assault by strangulation and misdemeanor domestic assault.
- Officers responded to a medical where an individual was electrocuted while working near a crane. The worker was maneuvering on one of the outriggers (stabilization legs) of the crane when the crane's boom accidentally made contact with an overhead power line. The worker was conscious and breathing upon officers' arrival but had serious burns to their hands and was hospitalized for further evaluation.
- A rollover crash on County Road 42 by Abbeyfield. The 27-year-old male driver fell asleep at the wheel. Fortunately, it appeared only minor injuries were sustained after rolling the vehicle and going more then 100 yards off the roadway.

- Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle going approximately 75 mph on County Road 46. The 19-year-old female was upset she got pulled over and said she was late for work. The officer smelled a strong odor of marijuana in the vehicle and conducted a search. The female was cited for speeding and possession of drug paraphernalia.



- A report of a theft from a motor vehicle from the 15XXX block of Shannon Parkway. A female reported that her purse, cell phone, and wallet were taken from her vehicle while dropping off her children at the daycare in the morning. No suspect information at this time.
- Homeowner on the 43XX block of Dakota Drive reported that someone cut up their Christmas lights they were using for decoration. Scrooge activity.
- Five separate callers provided information on a driver who fled the scene from an accident at Hwy 3 and County Road 46. With those callers' help, officers located the driver at Burger King and gave his information to the State Patrol, who was handling the accident report.
