

STORY OF THE WEEK

SEE SOMETHING? SAY SOMETHING!

THE STORY OF THE WEEK IS A PRIME EXAMPLE OF CALLING 911 WHEN YOU SEE SOMETHING AND THINK THAT IT DOES NOT LOOK RIGHT. THIS PAST WEEK A MOTORIST WAS DRIVING ON CR-42 AND SAW A PEDESTRIAN THAT WAS NOT DRESSED APPROPRIATELY FOR THE -15 DEGREE WEATHER WALKING ON THE SHOULDER OF THE ROAD. BEING CONCERNED FOR THE PEDESTRIAN'S SAFETY, THE MOTORIST CALLED 911 AND REPORTED WHAT HE SAW.

Further details on this call on Co. Rd 42 near Akron were that the passing motorist informed the 911 dispatcher that he had almost hit the pedestrian while driving due to the poor visibility in the area. Our Patrol Officers were able to locate her, and confirmed that she was not dressed for the extremely cold weather. The officers were very concerned for her well being and they investigated further. They determined that she was she was impaired and that her presence on the roadside wasn't making sense. She told them that she had left a house in Apple Valley and that she planned to walk to Le Sueur, MN, which is about an hour away by car. After further inquiries, she admitted smoking an unknown narcotic and consuming alcohol. Out of concern for her physical condition, officers requested medics to respond to evaluate her. An Emergency Hospitalization and Evaluation Form was completed and she was transported to the hospital to be further evaluated by a medical doctor.

The Rosemount Police Department is very thankful for the concerned citizen who called 911 to alert Rosemount Officers of the situation so that they could locate and provide medical assistance to the woman before the situation became worse.





WEEKLY SNAPSHOT

FOOTPRINTS LEAD TO DWI ARREST

Officers responded to a report of a pickup in the ditch along Hwy 3 near 120th Street. The caller stated that the female driver told them she lived just up the road, but as she spoke, they noticed that her she was slurring her words. When officers arrived, the driver had left. Officers followed the fresh footprints leading away from the vehicle to a nearby home.

Officers found the 25-year-old female there and she had already gone to bed. The officers investigated further and determined that she was impaired. She was arrested for 3rd degree DWI.



PURSUIT OF STOLEN VEHICLE TERMINATED

Officers attempted to stop a vehicle speeding on Highway 52, but the driver of the vehicle refused to pull over and continued driving S/B. Out of concern for public safety, The officer choose not pursue the vehicle, however, they requested Dispatch to put an alert out on the vehicle for agencies south of Rosemount. An hour later, the Goodhue County Sheriff's Department notified Rosemount PD, that they had located the vehicle with one passenger present. They also determined that the vehicle had been stolen out of Rochester and had located various drug-related items within the vehicle.



DOMESTIC IN THE CELT'S PARKING LOT




Officers responded to a domestic in the Celt's parking lot and determined that a male and a female were verbally arguing.

17-YEAR-OLD OVERDOSED



A 17-year-old male overdosed on a combination of Xanax and Percocet. He was unconscious when officers and medics arrived but fortunately regained consciousness on his own. He was transported to the hospital.

MALE ARRESTED FOR ASSAULTING FEMALE

Officers responded to a domestic dispute around 3:30 am in the morning. It was reported to them that the injured female had been kicked in the head by the male during an argument. Officers spoke the individuals involved and then arrested the male for misdemeanor domestic assault, because of his actions during the incident.
